Watch for end of summer season sales for goodies you can use for your quilting! Cloth garden gloves with rubber palm or finger spots can be used to better grip your quilt sandwich and control movement when machine quilting. Styrofoam pool noodles are great for rolling your quilts for storage or for shipping. The noodles can be easily cut to needed length with a kitchen knife and easily labeled on sides or end with a sharpie marker.
